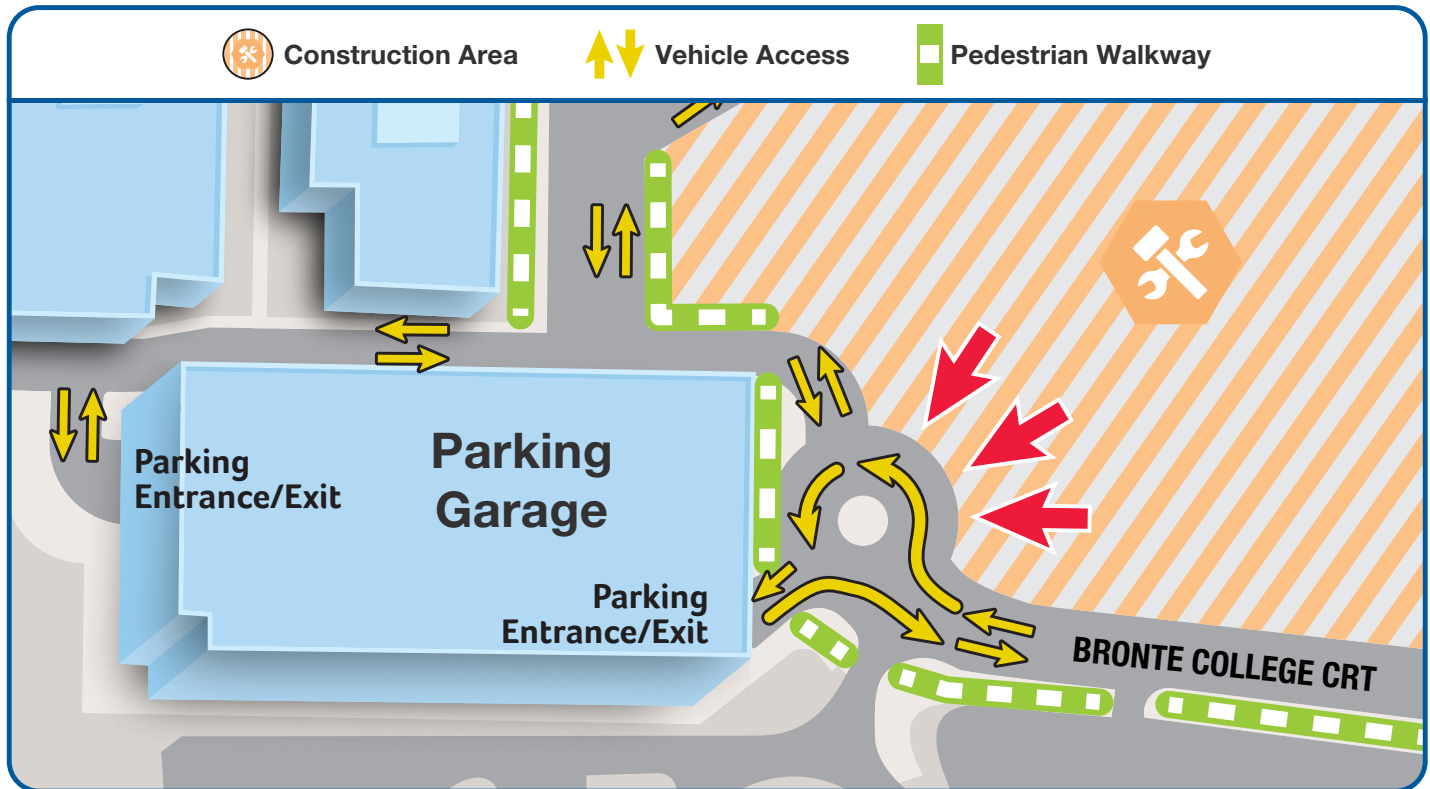


How to Use the New Roundabout

Slow down!



Watch for

and cyclists.



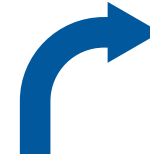
Yield to
traffic.



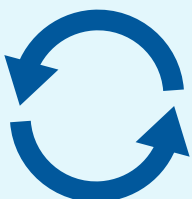
Enter when
safe. Travel
counter-
clockwise.



Stop only
when needed
to avoid a
collision.



Signal right
before
exiting the
roundabout.



IF YOU MISS YOUR EXIT

Keep going around until
you make it back to your
desired exit.

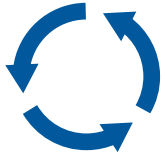
REMEMBER!

- If an emergency vehicle approaches, exit, then pull over safely
- Give large vehicles and hospital shuttles extra room.

What is a roundabout?



A circular intersection where traffic moves counter-clockwise around a centre island.

Who has the right of way?



Traffic in the roundabout and pedestrians at the crosswalk.

Do I stop before entering?



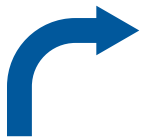
No, slow down and yield. Stop only if needed for traffic, pedestrians, or cyclists.

Is a roundabout the same as a four-way stop?



No. Yield to circulating traffic instead of taking turns.

How do I exit?



Signal right before exiting the roundabout.

What if I miss my exit?



Continue around until you reach your exit.

What about cyclists and pedestrians?



Watch for pedestrians at crosswalks.

Cyclists may ride through or walk their bike across.

Can large vehicles, hospital shuttles and emergency vehicles use the roundabout?



If an emergency vehicle approaches, exit, then pull over safely. Give large vehicles and hospital shuttles extra room.
