(Mississauga, ON) – Trillium Health Partners is proud to offer heartfelt congratulations to the Mississauga Academy of Medicine's inaugural class who celebrated their graduation from the University of Toronto (U of T) yesterday.

"We are so proud of our medical learners and what they have accomplished over the last four years. If they are the future of medicine in Mississauga, the future looks bright. We wish our students the best of luck as they move forward in their careers," said Michelle DiEmanuele, President and CEO, Trillium Health Partners.

Credit Valley Hospital and Trillium Health Centre entered into an affiliation agreement with U of T in 2007. Today, 52 students celebrate earning their MD degrees from U of T, having completed their training at the hospital. In 2014/15, 267 undergraduate medical learners and 376 postgraduate learners trained at Trillium Health Partners.
